- 3. Further promote the established Foundation Trainees Surgical Societies (FTSS) across the UK and liaise with local RSAs to offer leadership and guidance for FTSS activities
- 4. Promote the recently established Core Trainee Forum (CTF) across the UK and liaise with local RSAs to offer leadership and guidance for CTF activities
- 5. Offer leadership for organising the annual FTSS and the CTF National Conferences
- 6. Organise the RSA development days in April and November (Edinburgh) along with the 'all College meeting' in November each year
- 7. Plan and manage the pro-active turnover of appointments to the RSA network
- 8. Identify opportunities to link with both Dental Ambassadors and international Ambassadors and liaise with the Dental Faculty
- 9. Liaise with the Marketing and Communications staff in both Edinburgh and Birmingham to co-ordinate resources
