Frequently Asked Questions

1. When is the course held?

This is a self-led online course, there are no start or end dates.

2. Where is the course held?

This course can be accessed via the RCSEd [Virtual Learning Environment \(VLE\)](#) platform

3. How much will the course cost?

This course is free for FRRHH Members

4. Can I pay for access to the course without becoming a FRRHH Member?

No. By offering this course as part of the FRRHH membership benefit it is hoped that you will engage with the opportunity to join a wider humanitarian community in what we hope will become a professional home for humanitarian, remote and rural healthcare professionals that will improve the preparation and suitability of working in these environments. This home will aim to create a professional community by offering routes for sharing best practice, peer to peer support, career guidance as well as professional standard setting and educational activity. By drawing on the experience of RCSEd and the collective knowledge of humanitarian healthcare professionals, we will support continual professional development of individuals and their community.

6. I am a UK-Med Member, how do I gain access to the course?

7. How long will the course take to complete?

It is estimated the course will take 40 hours to complete including the online course material and “need to know” reading materials. The course also provides additional “nice to know” resources for those who wish to take their learning and research deeper.

8. Who is the course for?

- Any healthcare professional interested in humanitarian healthcare
- Healthcare professionals who have previously deployed and wish to reflect on their learning

9. Is the course open to international students?

Yes, all healthcare professionals across the globe who are interested in and wish to learn more about humanitarian healthcare are welcome. The course forms part of the FRRHH membership benefit and FRRHH is for all remote, rural and humanitarian healthcare professionals globally.

10. How is the course assessed?

Online multiple - choice assessment questions at the end of each module.

11. How do I get my certificate?

Once you have completed each online module and the module assessments you will be asked to complete a short course evaluation taking no longer than 10 minutes. This evaluation will be completed in the Virtual Learning Environment. Once this has been completed a certificate of completion will automatically be generated and sent to you by email.

12. What can my certificate be used for?

- A certificate of completion will allow you to demonstrate your interest in the field and provide evidence of your interest in humanitarian healthcare
- Those participating in the UK-Med Pre-Deployment training pathway will be required to send a copy of this certificate to their designated contact at UK-Med as proof of completion of the course

13. Does this course allow me to carry out additional duties on completion of the course?

No. Once completing the course you will be able to use your certificate of completion to demonstrate your interest in humanitarian healthcare. The course will not enable you to carry out additional duties or provide additional responsibilities to your role. It indicates your interest in humanitarian healthcare and your desire to progress the pursuit of a career paid or voluntarily.

14. What does each module consist of?

As this course is online and self-directed learning, it is entirely based on self-directed study. You are responsible for organising your time and making sure you complete each module and module online assessment. Each module is made up of:

- Online learning material for you to listen to, watch or read
- Suggested “need to know” and “nice to know” reading material
- Multiple choice online assessment questions to be completed at the end of each module
